**Lake George Opera at Saratoga's
49th Summer Season
July 1 -July 18, 2010**

Saratoga Springs, NY (May 11, 2010) Tears and laughter will be shared in July when Lake George Opera at Saratoga produces Georges Bizet's *Carmen* and Gaetano Donizetti's *Viva La Mamma*. This July marks the Company's 49th summer season of producing professional opera and its thirteenth performing at the intimate and unique Spa Little Theater.

The talented singers and all production staff responsible for "making the show go on", arrive in Saratoga at the beginning of June. The casts of both productions begin rigorous rehearsals while the production departments are busy at work building sets and backdrops, designing costumes and wigs, arranging lighting and sound and in essence, creating the magical world where operas come alive.

**Main Stage Productions
Spa Little Theater**

Ten productions of Bizet's *Carmen* and Donizetti's *Viva La Mamma* will be produced beginning on July 8th. *Carmen*, considered by some to be the most popular opera ever written, will feature rising star Kendall Gladen in the title role. Gladen is making her Company debut and has recently performed with Los Angeles Opera and Florida Grand Opera. Also making their LGOpera debuts are Joshua Kohl as Don Jose and Darren K. Stokes as Escamillo. Former Apprentice Artist Emily Newton will return to Saratoga singing the role of Micaela and Christopher Temporelli last seen in the 2008 production of *La Traviata*, will be Zuniga. Jose Maria Condemi who directed the Company's winning production of *The Barber of Seville* in 2006 will return to direct *Carmen* and LGOpera at Saratoga's Artistic Director Curtis Tucker will conduct.

Performances: July 8th, July 10th & July 16th at 7:30p.m; July 12th, July 14th & July 18th at 2:00 p.m.

A hilarious comic opera never before seen in Saratoga, will be performed when the Company produces Donizetti's *Viva La Mamma*. Richard Holmes, who has sung with the Metropolitan Opera and was featured in the LGOpera's 2006 production of *Il Maestro Di Cappella*, will sing the role of Agata. Elizabeth Andrews Roberts who amazed audiences and critics as Violetta in the Company's production of *La Traviata*, will return to the Spa Little Theater stage singing the

role of Daria. Newcomers to Saratoga, Jennifer Roderer and Anna Steenerson round out the fantastic cast with **Nelson Sheeley** directing. Sheeley a familiar face around LGOpera at Saratoga has directed Company productions of *Don Pasquale*, *The Pirates of Penzance* and *Tartuffe*. John Douglas, the gifted director of the Apprentice Artist Class, will conduct. **Performances: July 9th & July 15th at 7:30 p.m.; July 11th & July 17th at 2:00 p.m.**

Carmen and *Viva La Mamma* will be sung in their original languages. English titles will be projected at all performances.

Under the direction of Chorus Master John Douglas, these emerging talents annually appear in the mainstage productions and perform at various concerts and outreach performances including the annual Saratoga Opera Ball and during SaratogaArtsFest.
